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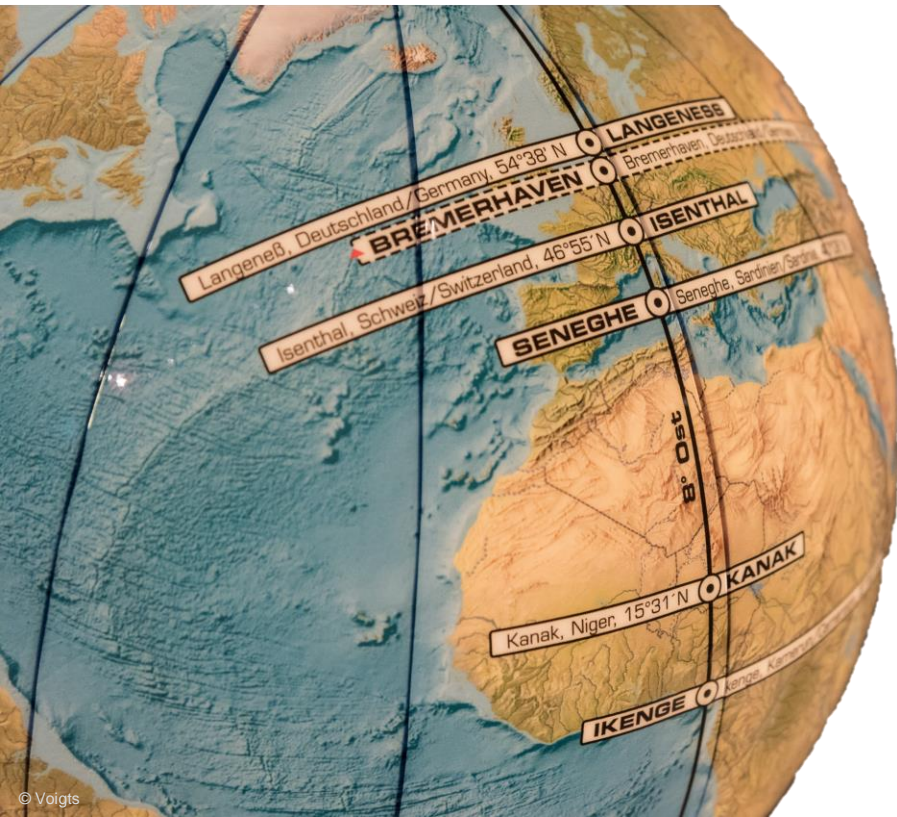

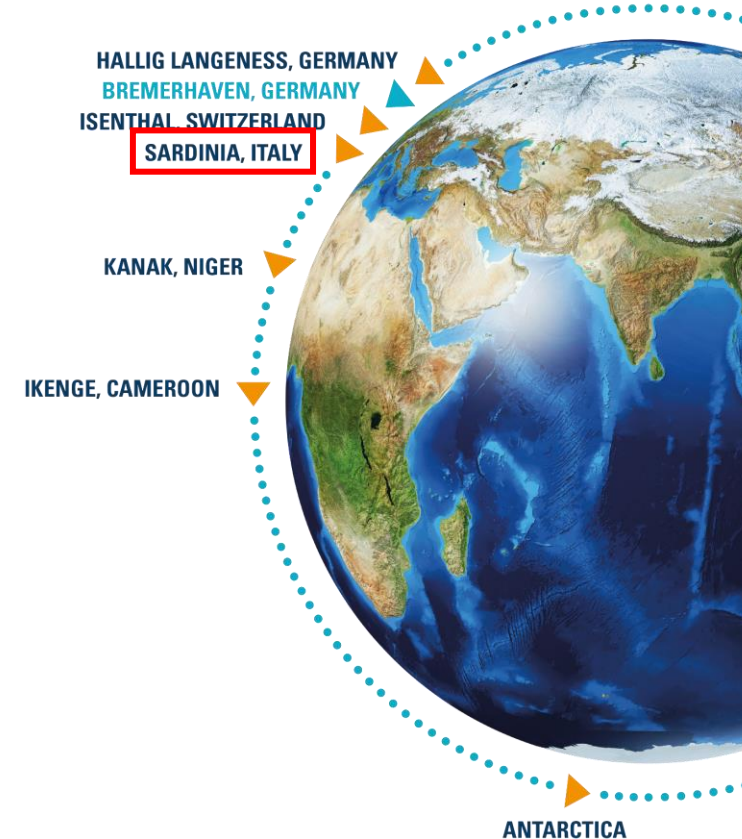

Italy

Who said Zero Waste cannot work in tourist destinations? In 2000, Sardinia was Italy's worst performing region in waste management with a separate collection rate of 3.8%. Since then the situation radically changed, thanks to the decision of setting up a Regional Programme for organic waste within its Waste Management Plan in 2004.

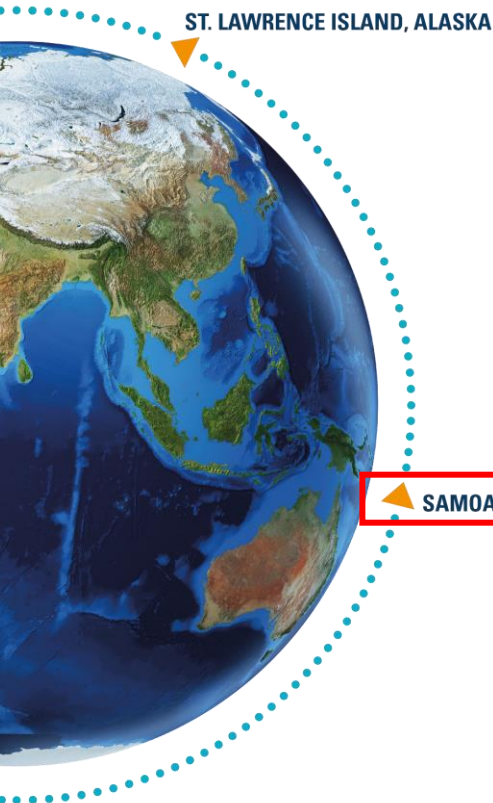

Samoa Community-Based Fisheries Management Program (CBFMP)

- Initiated in 1995
- Idea: people who directly depend on coastal resources should be in charge of conservation and management
- Voluntary participation of villages
- Village societal groups develop management plans
- National legislators ratify plans as by-laws, making them enforceable

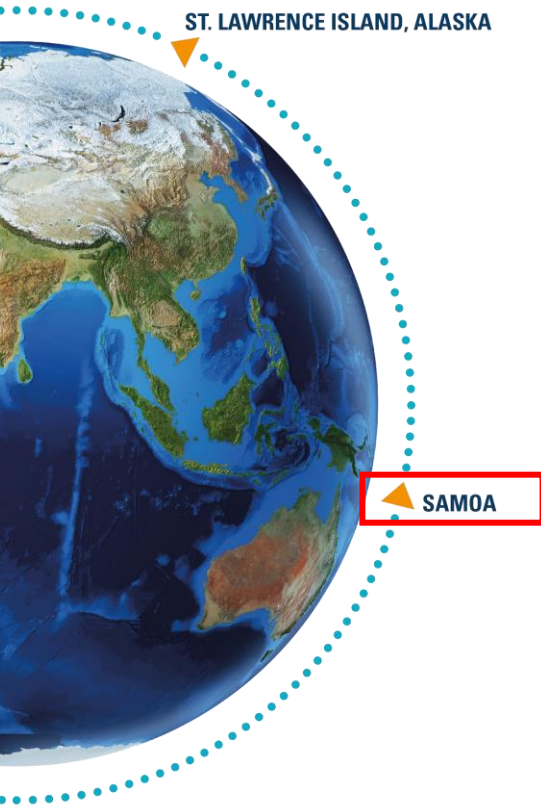

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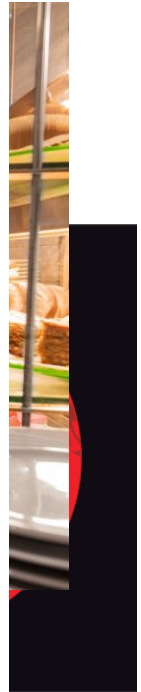


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A few things to keep in mind during the exhibition
